The Board of Directors has established \$3,500 to be paid in cash prize awards. The Society is offering this competition to build an interest in history, and specifically Middletown history, in students; and to introduce them to the joy and satisfaction of ferreting out a story from long forgotten facts and sources. This year's topic will be based on Middletown street names. What the Society will gain from this competition is accurate research into our history that will be permanently kept in our files for future researchers and visitors to our research room.

In Memoriam

We were recently saddened by the unexpected death of one of our most active members, Gail Maclary Chickersky. She died on May 1, 2019 of undiagnosed leukemia.

Gail was a regular attendee of our monthly meetings, gave several donations to our collection, and was on the panel reviewing papers submitted for our historical research paper awards.

She was born in 1949 in Newark, where she lived her entire life. She was active in three historical societies: Newark, Pencader and Middletown. She was a professional accountant, and gave us sage advice on more than one occasion during discussions of a financial nature. Gail generously donated several items of local importance to our Society, including a spear used by Major William Rothwell in the early 1800's, which had come down through her family. She also gave a doll and high chair from the Hoffecker family. Gail was a helpful member of last year's committee for the historical research paper awards and will be sorely missed.
